I. World Bank Preliminary Assessment of Direct Damages

The World Bank prepared a **Global Rapid Post-Disaster Damage Estimation** (GRADE) Report within the within two weeks of the earthquakes, to:

- Provide a *rapid*, *model-based estimate of the <u>direct physical damages</u> to residential and non-residential* buildings, and infrastructure, and
- Evaluate the **spatial distribution** of these damages.

According to the GRADE assessment, up until February 19, **direct physical damages** from the earthquakes were estimated at <u>US\$34.2 billion</u> which is equivalent to 4 percent of Türkiye's 2021 GDP:

- 53% to residential buildings
- 28% non-residential buildings
 - 19% infrastructure

The **GRADE Report acknowledged that recovery and reconstruction costs would be much larger, potentially twice as large**, and that GDP losses associated to economic disruptions would also add to the cost of the earthquakes.

II. TÜRKİYE Earthquakes Recovery and Reconstruction Assessment (TERRA)

- **TERRA Assessment was conducted and presented at March 20 Donor Conference by** Government of Türkiye under coordination of Strategy and Budget Office (SBO)
- All estimates were prepared using data provided by ministries, public and private agencies, which was compiled and filtered by SBO
- UNDP (coordinating for UN), World Bank and EU collaborated and provided inputs to the preliminary assessment

Limitations of TERRA:

- Limited timeframe for assessment of a very large area
- Data collection is still ongoing
- Aftershocks were still taking place causing further damage
- Provincial, private-public and urban-rural disaggregation, and calculation of damage, loss and needs are not final
- Needs were still being fully identified and costed for all sectors
- Prioritization of needs within sectors and across sectors was still being developed

II. TÜRKİYE Earthquakes Recovery and Reconstruction Assessment (TERRA)

HUMAN IMPACT

- **15+ million people** directly affected, (16.4% of Türkiye's population)
 - Of which 1.7 million Syrians UTP (50% of total in Türkiye)
- As of March 15th: **48,448 casualties**
- More than **115,000 injured**
- More than **2 million** in various temporary housing accommodations
- **3.3 million displaced** within and from the earthquake-affected areas to other provinces

FINANCIAL IMPACT

PHYSICAL IMPACT

Collapsed + severely and moderately damaged infrastructure and physical assets which need to be rebuilt:

- 272,860 buildings
- 649,546 housing units
- 940 school buildings
- 42 hospital buildings
- 1,083 km of drinking water network
- 1,842 km sewage network
- 148 km of roads
- 14 irrigation dams and ponds

The Government's assessment estimates the **recovery and reconstruction needs** for **housing at US\$56.9 billion**, for **public infrastructure and buildings at US\$12.9 billion**, and for **health at US\$4.3 billion**.

III. Mobilization of Resources for Reconstruction and Coordination with Development Partners

On March 20, 2023, *a total of EUR 6.05 billion in grants and loans were pledged for Türkiye* during the International Donors' Conference "Together for the People in *Türkiye and Syria" which was held in Brussels.*

IV. World Bank Group (WBG) Support Package

The WBG support package is being structured around the reconstruction of infrastructure, provision of public services, and economic recovery.

- **Analytical Work and Technical Assistance** : GRADE Report prepared and support to TERRA and Donor Conference Presentation; Bank-Executed Trust Funds mobilized to provide technical assistance on resilient and inclusive post-earthquake recovery.
- Mobilization of targeted support through existing project portfolio: Existing
 projects are being rebalanced or repurposed to support post-disaster damage
 assessment, the provision of human development services, and social protection
 and labor activities.

Delivery of new emergency projects on a fast-track basis: This includes a proposed US\$ 1 B *Türkiye Earthquake Recovery and Reconstruction Project* to support restoration of essential services and reconstruction of rural housing in affected region, and a proposed US\$ 450 M Post-Earthquake Micro, Small, and Medium Enterprises Recovery Project to support MSMEs in affected region.
